

Day 1

Helsinki

- Coach transfer: Airport \square Hotel
- Coach at disposal for 2 hours
- Overnight at Scandic Helsinki Aviapolis (was Cumulus Airport Vantaa) or similar

Day 2

Helsinki

- Breakfast at hotel
- Coach at disposal for 7 hours
- Local guide for 5 hours
- Ferry crossing: Market square \square Market square
- Suomenlinna Museum
- Suomenlinna is an 18th-century sea fortress and nature area with centuries-old artillery and defensive walls, spread across 6 linked islands. Walking trails cross parkland between popular sights like the King's Gate drawbridge and Suomenlinna Museum, which recounts military and maritime history. Submarine Vesikko lets visitors explore a restored 1930s vessel. There's also a brewery and several waterside restaurants.

Day 3

Helsinki

- Breakfast at hotel
- Local guide for 3 hours
- During the tour of the Finnish capital you will admire the major sights such as the Rock Church, the Senate Square surrounded by the Lutheran Cathedral of Helsinki, the Senate, the University and Library of Helsinki, the Sibelius monument, the Olympic stadium, and the new Opera House.
- Coach at disposal for 5 hours
- Entrance - Rock Church
- The interior walls are created naturally by rock.
- Overnight cruise from Helsinki to Stockholm in B-Class, Inside Cabin - Tallink Silja Line

Day 4

Stockholm

- Breakfast on board
- Coach at disposal for 10 hours
- Local guide for 4 hours
- The visit of Stockholm, a city often referred to as the Venice of the North, starts at Fjällgatan to see the magnificent view of the Swedish capital, spread out on 14 islands with Lake Mälaren on one side and the Baltic Sea on the other. You will see the Old Town with its fascinating narrow cobble-stoned alleys, the Royal palace, the Cathedral, and the City Hall where the festivities of the annual Nobel Prize award takes place. The visit also takes you to the recreational island Djurgården where many of the fine museums are found.
- Entrance - Vasa Museum
- The Vasa ship capsized and sank in Stockholm 1628. After 333 years on the sea bed the warship was salvaged and the voyage could continue. Today Vasa is the world's only preserved 17th century ship and the most visited museum in Scandinavia.
- Overnight at Scandic Talk (former Rica Talk) or similar
