Copenhagen

- Coach transfer: Airport ⇄ Hotel
- Coach at disposal for 3:30 hours
- Entrance - Tivoli
- Opened in 1843, it's the second-oldest theme park in the world and the world's most-visited seasonal theme park. Its delightful mix of rides, attractions, performances and culture make it a treat for adults and children alike.
- Overnight at Scandic Hvidovre or similar

Day 2

Copenhagen

- Breakfast at hotel
- Long distance coach starting: Copenhagen
- Canal Cruise - Grand Tour of Copenhagen
- A classic canal tour around Copenhagen's harbour and the canals. The guide will present churches, castles, old listed houses, new buildings and all other sights of interest.
- Local guide for 4 hours
- The visit of Copenhagen takes You into the heart of the Danish capital, full of historical buildings and ancient streets. You will see the Little Mermaid and the Gefion fountain, the Royal residence Amalienborg Palace and the Nyhavn Canal with its charming outdoor restaurants and picturesque cafés, the Christiansborg Castle, the home of the Danish Parliament, the Royal Opera House, and many more sights.

Day 3

Copenhagen, Stockholm

- Breakfast at hotel
- Long distance coach
- One way bridge crossing - Øresundsbroen
- Entrance - Ice Bar Stockholm
- The interior is made out of sculpted ice from the arctic Torne River, just like the glasses drinks are served out of. Entry fee includes a cocktail.
- Overnight at Scandic Infra City or similar

Day 4

Stockholm

- Breakfast at hotel
- Long distance coach ending: Stockholm
- Local guide for 4 hours
- The visit of Stockholm, a city often referred to as the Venice of the North, starts at Fjällgatan to see the magnificent view of the Swedish capital, spread out on 14 islands with Lake Mälaren on one side and the Baltic Sea on the other. You will see the Old Town with its fascinating narrow cobble stoned alleys, the Royal palace, the Cathedral, and the City Hall where the festivities of the annual Nobel Prize award takes place. The visit also takes You to the recreational island Djurgården where many of the fine museums are found.
- Entrance - Vasa Museum
- The Vasa ship capsized and sank in Stockholm 1628. After 333 years on the sea bed the warship was salvaged and the voyage could continue. Today Vasa is the world's only preserved 17th century ship and the most visited museum in Scandinavia.
- Overnight at Scandic Infra City or similar
